## About this Service

### Family Service

As you participate in this service, the language will feel at once simplified and familiar. Each week, we will pray, sing, and reflect on the Word of God in language that is intentionally accessible for children. At the same time, we draw on the essential elements of Episcopal worship—the Lord's Prayer, the collects, the confession and the creed—learning together to pattern our prayer after the Book of Common Prayer.

In the Baptismal Covenant, the Church vows to support the spiritual development of each new member of the Body of Christ. We often think of this in terms of adults supporting children in their faith formation. In truth, each of us, no matter our age, can help support the spiritual growth of every other member of our church community. One of the many ways we do this is by participating together in worship.

By worshipping together in this way, we can help our children experience the unshakable love of God in Jesus Christ. And adults, in turn, may be surprised to find themselves supported in their lives in Christ by the young people of our community.

# The Reading

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

When the day of Pentecost had come, the apostles were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, “Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, “Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o’clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

‘In the last days it will be, God declares,  
that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,  
and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,  
and your young men shall see visions,  
and your old men shall dream dreams.  
Even upon my slaves, both men and women,
