About this Service Noonday Prayer

This service of noonday prayer includes an opening versicle, a selection from the psalms, scripture lessons, and prayers from the *Book of Common Prayer* (BCP). It is based on the "little offices" of Christian monasticism, historically said at 9am, 12 noon, and 3pm, which were known as the third, sixth, and ninth hours of the day. Private devotions at these hours associated with the events of the Passion have been observed by Christians since the second century. Although these hours of prayer were included in the Primers of King Henry VIII and Queen Elizabeth, these offices were not included in any Prayer Books before the twentieth century. The 1979 BCP is the first American Prayer Book to include this office.

Unlike Holy Eucharist, which requires an ordained priest to administer the Sacrament, a layperson may officiate the liturgies of the Daily Office, which also includes Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer. At Trinity Church, we rarely have the opportunity to offer our midday prayers using this unique rite.
