

Last fall, we began a new Sunday worship schedule by merging our 9am and 9:15am congregations here in Trinity Church.

We experienced the wonderful potential of this service during the summer: an intergenerational form of worship that expresses the reverence, joy, and meaning elicited by the Spirit when we are fully ourselves, together before God.

Each week, we will pray, sing, and reflect on the Word of God in ways that feel both simple and familiar. This service draws on the essential elements of Episcopal worship—the Lord's Prayer, the collects, the confession and the creed—and the patterns of worship described in the Book of Common Prayer.

By worshipping together in this way, we can help our children experience the unshakable love of God in Jesus Christ. And adults, in turn, may be surprised to find themselves supported in their lives in Christ by the young people of our community.





The Nicene Creed

Congregational Voice

"O LORD, you have searched me and known me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away. You search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways. Even before a word is on my tongue, O LORD, you know it completely. You hem me in, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain it" (*Psalm 139:1–6*). The first time I remember reading this verse I was probably 13 or 14 years old, and these words touched me in a way that nothing had before. 
