About this Service

Last fall, we began a new Sunday worship schedule by merging our 9am and 9:15am congregations here in Trinity Church.

We experienced the wonderful potential of this service during the summer: an intergenerational form of worship that expresses the reverence, joy, and meaning elicited by the Spirit when we are fully ourselves, together before God.

Each week, we will pray, sing, and reflect on the Word of God in ways that feel both simple and familiar. This service draws on the essential elements of Episcopal worship—the Lord's Prayer, the collects, the confession and the creed—and the patterns of worship described in the Book of Common Prayer.

By worshipping together in this way, we can help our children experience the unshakable love of God in Jesus Christ. And adults, in turn, may be surprised to find themselves supported in their lives in Christ by the young people of our community.

The Word of God

The First Reading

Genesis 2:15–17, 3:1–7

Reader A Reading from the Book of Genesis.

The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. And the LORD God commanded the man, “You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die.”

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LORD God had made. 

Grant, we beseech you, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with your grace and heavenly benediction; and also that we and all your whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him.

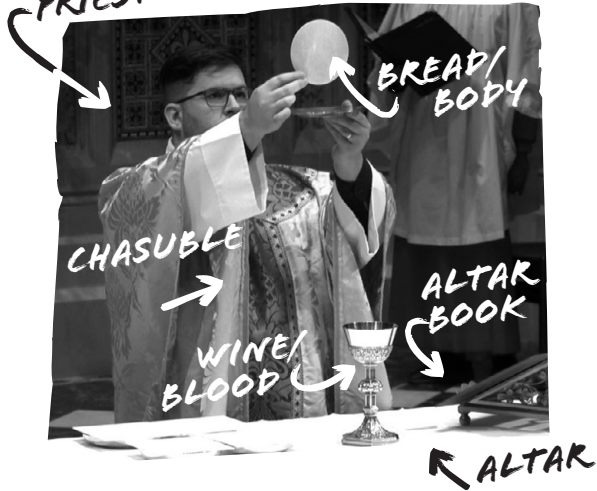

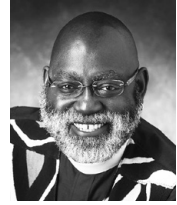
