About this Service Reception of a Priest

Thank you for joining us this morning for our service of Holy Eucharist, and as we celebrate the reception of Jorge Antonio Ortiz as a priest in the Episcopal Church.

When a priest is ordained by a bishop of a church in historic succession, but not in full communion with the Episcopal Church, and they feel called to priestly ministry in our denomination, they begin a process of discernment. This process includes regular prayer, reflection, and time in fellowship with a congregation. It also requires additional study in the theology, history, and liturgy of the Episcopal Church. At the end of this process, with the Bishop's invitation, a priest's holy orders may be received into the Episcopal Church.

Our parish family rejoices with Jorge and his family as he joins our Church family and begins his priestly ministry among us.




